Require that accurate and up-to-date snow logs are maintained. These document what was done, weather conditions, who performed the task and any comments. Logs are vital in the event of a slip and fall – they prove due diligence and not negligence



Understand legal liability

Under the Occupiers Liability Act, the condo corporation has a duty to keep its common areas safe for visitors and residents alike.



Review Insurance

Review your liability insurance to avoid unwanted surprises or gaps in coverage.
